

Welcome to the Faith in Harm Reduction Newsletter!

We are thrilled to be in conversation and building spiritual community and power with you!

We are looking forward to connecting you with the Faith in Harm Reduction network and our shared work to promote. flourishing, justice, and community building with people who use drugs.

In each issue, we will highlight work that Faith in Harm Reduction members are leading in their communities and

congregations, spotlight individual spiritual leaders, share spiritual, educational and other community building resources, as well as connect you with upcoming events and opportunities to take action on critical harm reduction issues. And so we are launching this newsletter with one such action opportunity!

Faith in Harm Reduction has partnered with Clergy for a New Drug Policy to launch a faith-leaders sign on letter to support

the opening of Overdose Prevention Centers (OPCs) sometimes called supervised consumption sites or safer injection facilities. 120 OPCs operate in countries across the globe. They are an evidenced based harm-reduction strategy that saves lives,

improves health, and promotes connection and access to care. OPCs provide people who use drugs with a safe and

supervised environment to use in and provide critical services like overdose response, drug testing, access to sterile harm reduction supplies, as well as connection to social services and supports. No one has ever died from an overdose in an OPC. They've been studied intensively and shown not to increase drug use or crime in the communities where they operate.

Tragically, they are still considered illegal under federal law. New York City opened the United State's first sanctioned OPCs last November, in a direct challenge to these unjust restrictions.

Since opening, the two OPCs in NYC have saved over 250 beloved lives from a fatal overdose!

At the beginning of May, Attorney General Merrick Garland will make a determination as to whether or not the federal government will move to close these centers or allow them to operate.



Through the hosting of events and a growing national network of Faith in Harm Reduction leaders who provide peer to peer support, information sharing, and spiritual care for the harm reduction movement, Faith in Harm Reduction strengthens spiritual resources for harm reduction and intersectional healing and justice movements.
